Chapter 1 Product Introduction

1.1 Introduction

Information release system, mainly built up by the information release server (hereinafter referred to as the server) and information release terminal (hereinafter referred to as the terminal), is used to broadcast information, release news, advertise products, etc. It is applicable to industry of entertainment, finance, traffic, etc.










1.2 Main Features

- Manage users by user level. Allocate permission for users according to user level.
- Provides timed startup/shutdown and timed volume to keep terminal long running.
- Material and program check feature. Adding materials and programs without being checked to schedule and playing them in terminal are not allowed.
- Supports setting and editing schedule.
- Playback specified program after startup.
- Supports editing program parameters, including background picture, video/picture/subtitle division, playlist, etc.
- Cut in specified schedule like advertisement during playback.
- Play specified schedules in specific period.
- Arrange a play time for released programs.
- Send emergency information and play them according to their priorities.
- Supports screenshot for reviewing the terminal playback status.
- Provides logs. You can search logs by designated search conditions.
- Smart commercial feature supporting people counting and people analysis.

Chapter 2 Remote Control Operations

2.1 Functions of Remote Control Keys

2.2 Remote Control Mode

A remote control is divided into two modes: 1-1 mode and 1-N mode.

- 1-1 mode: a remote control is bound to one terminal.
- 1-N mode: a remote control is unbound to any one single terminal.

 **NOTE**

A remote control is in 1VN comparison mode by default.



Table 2-2 Remote Control Mode Description

Mode	Description
1-1 Mode	The remote control only can control the terminal bound to it.
1-N Mode	The remote control can control any unbound terminals.

2.3 Bind a Remote Control to a Terminal

Purpose:



After being bound to the remote control, the terminal cannot be controlled by any other remote controls and the remote control cannot control any other terminals.

Step 1 Long press  key and  key on the remote control at the same time until the terminal pops up the verification code.

NOTE

The system pops up a box for you to enter the verification code only when your terminals are unbound to any remote controls.

Step 2 Enter the verification code of the desired terminal.

Step 3 Long press  key and  key at the same time until the system pops up the success message.

2.4 Unbind a Remote Control from a Terminal

Purpose:

After being unbound from the remote control, the terminal can be controlled by any unbound remote controls and the remote control cannot control any unbound terminals.

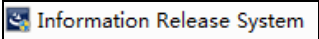
Long press  key and  key at the same time until the system pops up the success message.

NOTE

After you press the keys on the remote control, the terminal may not receive the unbinding request due to some reasons, such as device power-off or weak signals. In such cases, the remote control will be unbound from the terminal immediately while the terminal remains bound until it receives the request.

Chapter 3 Client Software Operation

3.1 Client Software Installation

Step 1 Get the installation package  from our official website or the delivered disc.

Step 2 Double-click the installation package to start software installation wizard.

Step 3 Follow the wizard to finish the installation.


3.2 Client Software Login

Purpose:

Before any operation, you need to log into the information release server.

Before you start:

Install an information release server first. And ensure the network connection between the server and the information release system is well.

Step 1 After installation finished, double-click the  icon to run the software.

Step 2 Click **Server Configuration**.

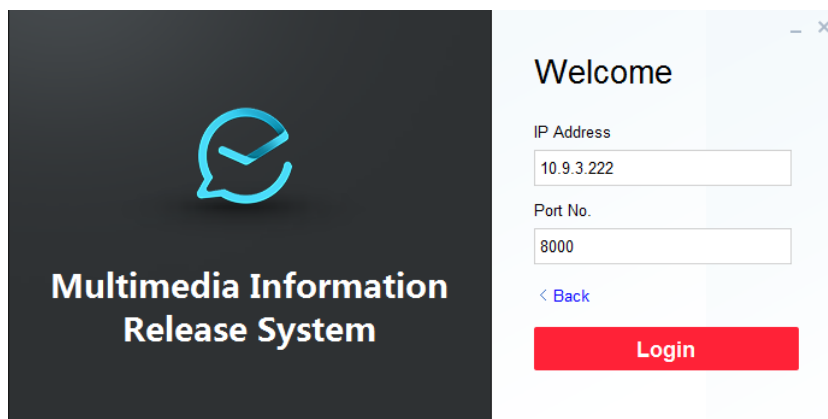


Figure 3-1 Login Interface

Step 3 Enter **IP Address** and **Port No.** of information release server to log in.

Step 4 Click **Back** to go back to login interface.

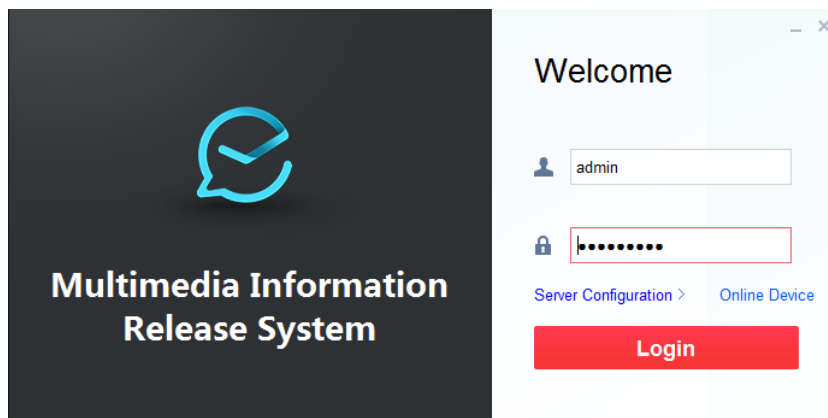


Figure 3-2 Server Configuration

Step 5 Enter **User Name** and **Password** of information release server.

Step 6 Click **Login**.

Step 7 After login, wizard pops up guiding you with adding material, program, and schedule.

For the new information release server, to ensure the server functions normally, you need to follow the guide to initialize its HDD.

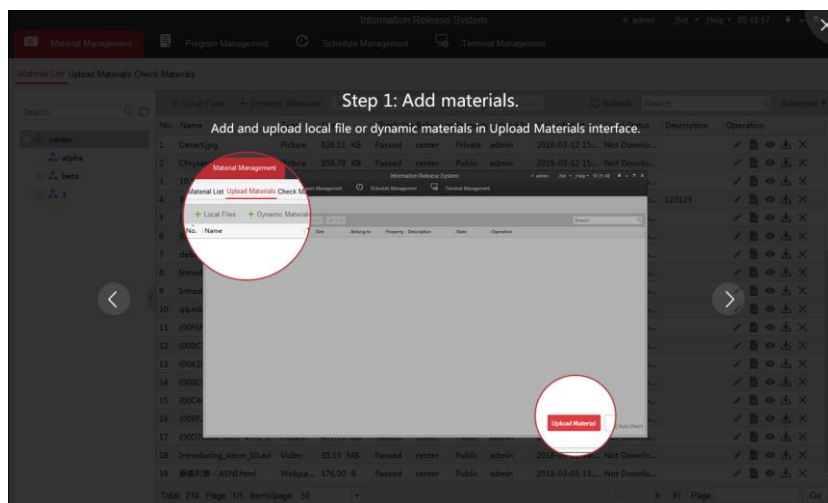


Figure 3-3 Wizard

3.3 Activate Information Release Terminal

Purpose:

For the first time to use an information release terminal, activate it before any operation.

Step 1 Run client software.

Step 2 Click **Online Device**.

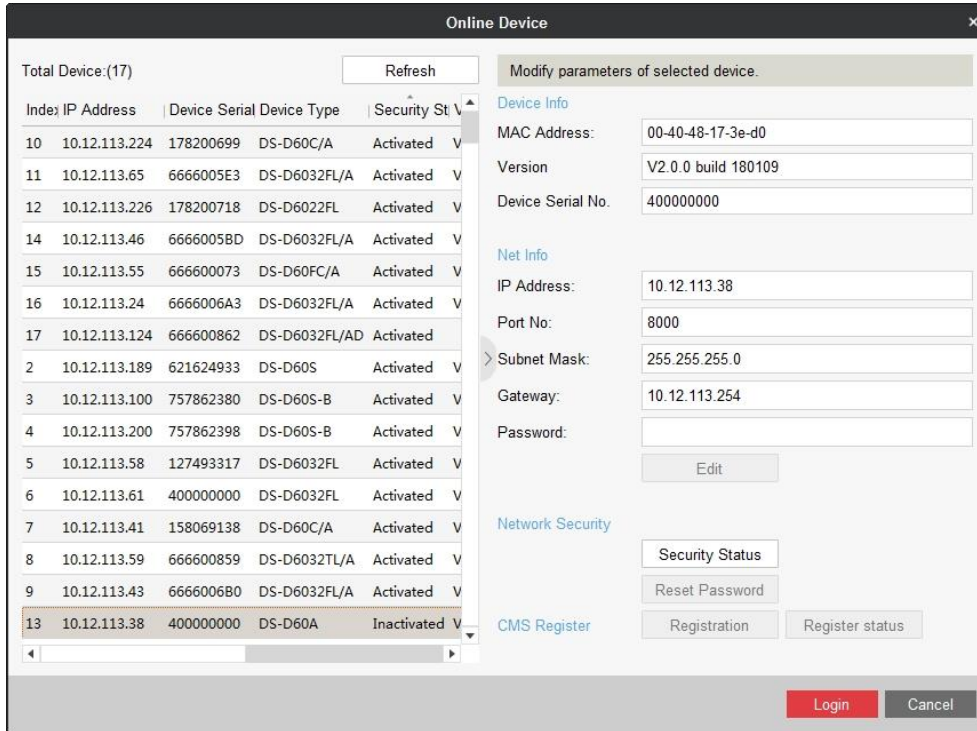


Figure 3-4 Online Device

Step 4 Enter Password, enter the same password in Confirm Password text-field, and click **Apply** to activate the device.

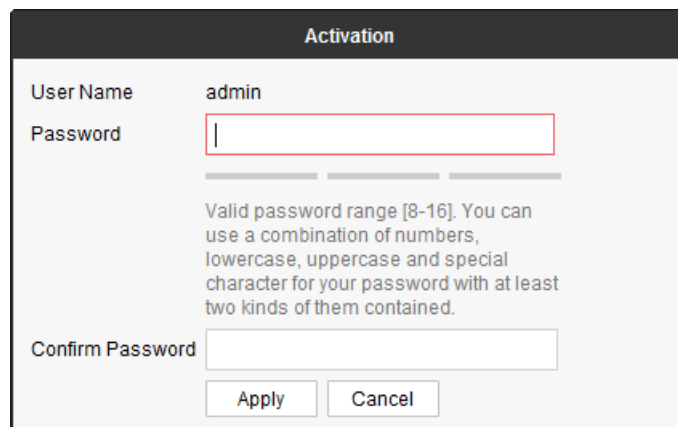


Figure 3-6 Activation

3.4 Reset Password

To add a terminal to a server, register the terminal in the server first.

Before you start:

Activate the terminal to register.

Step 1 Run client software.

Step 2 Click **Online Device**.

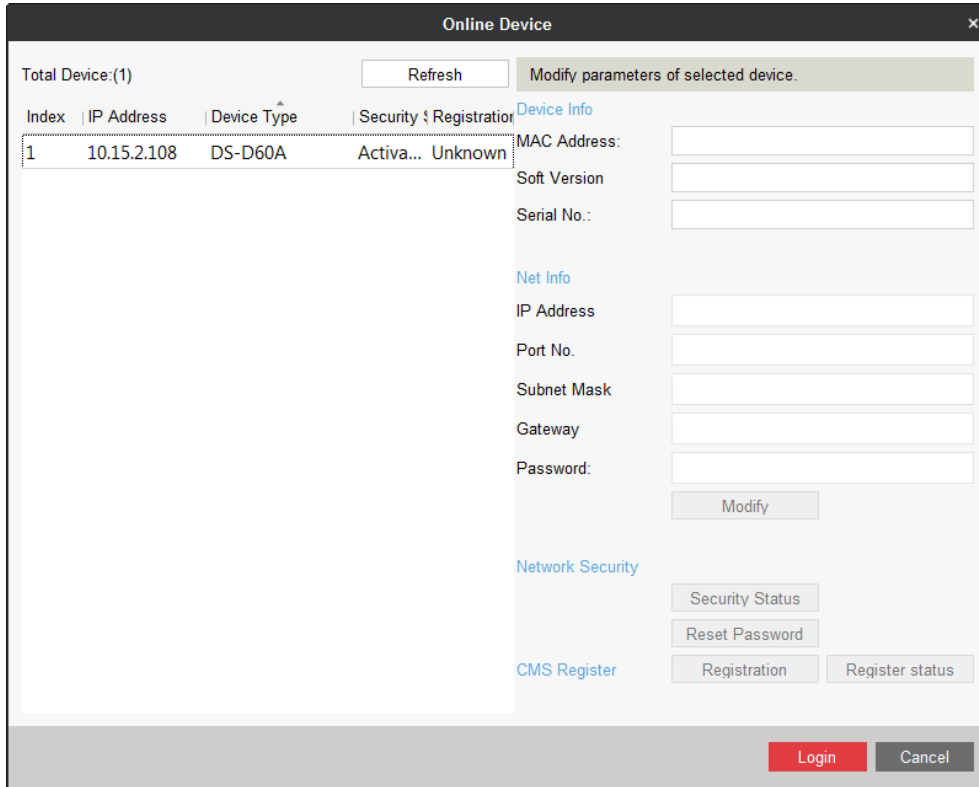


Figure 3-8 Online Device

Step 3 Select an activated terminal and click .

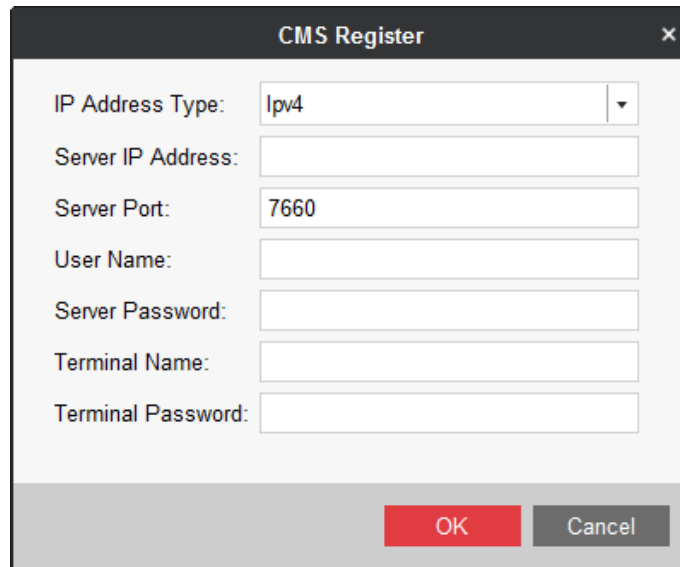


Figure 3-9 CMS Register

Step 7 Click **Save**.

Chapter 4 Material Management

Purpose:

Add, modify, delete, preview, download, and check materials.

Click the **Material Management** tab in menu bar.

4.1 Add Multimedia Material

Purpose:

Two types of material are supported: local material and dynamic material.



- Up to 10,000 materials can be uploaded.
- The maximum size for a single material is 4 GB.
- The maximum resolution for a picture is 3840 × 2160.

4.1.1 Add Local Material

Purpose:

Local material includes the picture, audio, video, txt, pdf, app, and web file. Here are the supported formats for each type.

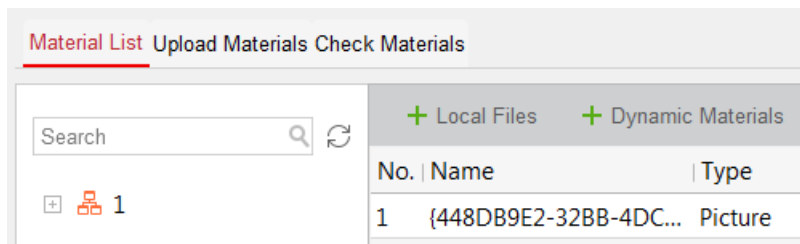


Figure 4-1 Material Management

4.1.2 Add Dynamic Material

Purpose:

Dynamic materials include webpage, IP camera, stream media server, URL picture, and general.



- Webpage: An URL address.
- General data: Data from third-party platforms like queue management device and pop-up image device. Supported formats for pop-up image: bmp, jpg, and png.

Step 1 Click **Dynamic Materials**.

Step 2 Select **Material Type**.

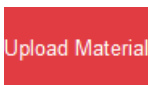
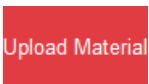

Step 4 Click **Upload Material**.

4.1.3 Replace Material

Purpose:

Replace an uploaded material by a material with the same type and name.

Step 1 When uploading a local/dynamic material, select a material of the same name and type with the material to replace.

Step 2 Click . Then a message box pops up indicating the material is duplicate and  turns to .

Step 3 Optionally, check the **Auto Apply** to automatically send the material to the program that contains the former material.

4.2 Check Material

Purpose:

Only checked material can be added to program. Only user has material check permission can check materials.

4.2.1 Auto Check

Purpose:

If you are a user with check permission, you can enable auto check when uploading material.

Step 1 Click the **Upload Materials** tab in Material Management interface.

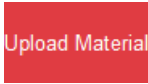
Step 2 Select materials to upload. For detailed steps, refer to:

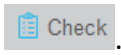

Step 5 Enter your check **Comment** if needed.

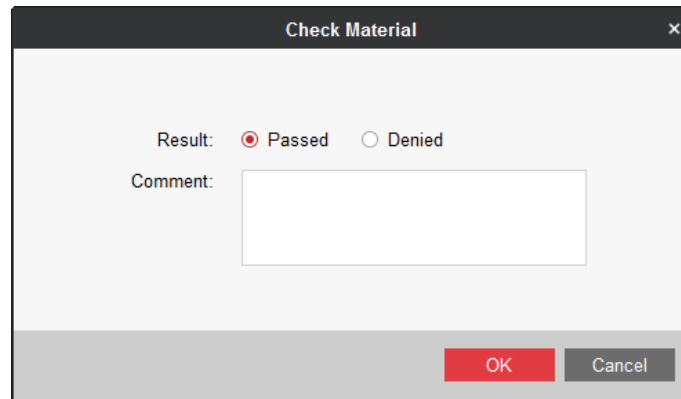


Figure 4-3 Check Material

Step 4 Enter **Comment**.

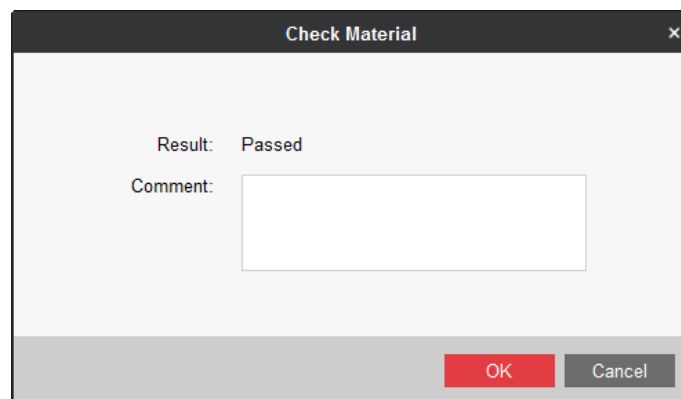

Step 1 Select the materials to delete.

Step 2 Click .

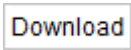
Step 3 Click **OK** in popup message box to delete.

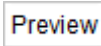
4.5 Preview/Download Material

Purpose:

You can download uploaded materials to the local path. The downloading status can be viewed in local status row. The downloaded materials including picture, txt document, video, and clock, can be previewed. Previewing dynamic material is not allowed.

Step 1 Click to select materials to download.

Step 2 Click  to start download. After the material is downloaded, the **Local Status** will turn from **Not Downloaded** to **Downloaded**.

Step 3 Optionally, you can select a downloaded material and click  to preview it.

Chapter 5 Program Management

Purpose:

You can create program using checked materials. The program layout is configurable. After program is added, you can modify, delete, preview, copy, and check programs.

Click the **Program Management** item in menu bar to enter program management interface.

5.1 Add Program

Purpose:

To add a program, create and configure the program pages first and specify materials for windows in page.



NOTE

- Up to 2,000 programs can be added.
- We take the example of Android standard program type to describe the steps. For the hyperlink feature of Android touchscreen, refer to *5.1.18 Hyperlink Feature for Android Touchscreen Program*.

Step 1 Click **Program Management** in menu bar.

Step 2 Click  in Program List tab.

Step 3 Configure program basic settings. Turn to *5.1.2 Configure Program Basic Settings*.

Step 4 Create and configure pages. Turn to *5.1.3 Manage Page*.

Step 5 Create programs. Turn to following section according to your needs: *Create Picture Program, Create PDF Program, Create Document Program, Create Audio/Video/Live Video Program, Create Webpage Program, Create App Program, Create Clock Program, Create Weather Program, Create Countdown Program, Create Video Input Program, Create Pop-up Image Program, Create Queue Manager Program, Create Capture Program, Create Button Program*.

5.1.2 Configure Program Basic Settings

Purpose:

Configure the program name, resolution, type, etc.

Step 1 Enter **Program Name** and **Description**.

Step 2 Select **Resolution** according to the installation orientation of information release terminal.

Step 3 Select **Program Type** according to your information release terminal model.

Step 4 Select **Share Property** as **Private** or **Public**.

- **Public:** The program is available for all users.
- **Private:** The program is only available for current users.

Step 5 Select the organization the program belongs to. For details about creating organization, refer to *8.1 Organization Resource*.

Step 6 Optionally, check **Resolution Self-Adaptive**. The window will automatically adjust the program display size to fit the window size.

5.1.3 Manage Page

Purpose:

You can create multiple pages for a program. Follow the steps to edit page layout and create layout template for reusing.



NOTE

Following materials cannot exist in the same page: video, audio, counting down, video input, live video, pop-up image, and queue management.

Step 1 Click **+** in the page list. Up to 32 pages can be added.

Step 2 Set page layout by one of the two options.

- Select an existing template.
- Edit the layout parameters including **Background Color**, **Duration Type**, and **Background Picture** in Property menu.



NOTE

You are recommended to set the duration type according to material type. For materials like video and audio, select it as **Auto**, then the page play duration equals material duration. For materials like picture and clock, select it as **Custom** and enter **Playback Duration**.

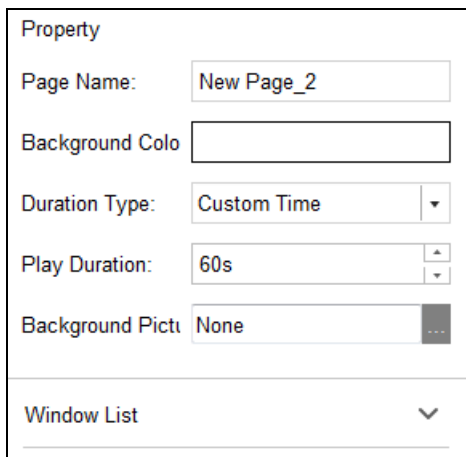


Figure 5-1 Page Property

Step 3 Enter **Page Name**.

Step 4 Click to select a window type to show in the page. Then a window will pop up in the display area. Window position and size are adjustable in Linked Material Configuration Panel.

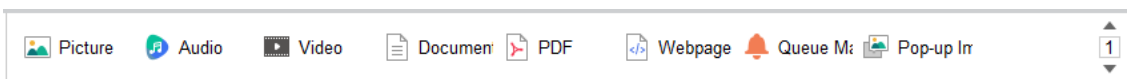


Figure 5-2 Window Type List

Step 1 Configure program basic settings. For details, refer to 5.1.2 *Configure Program Basic Settings*.

Step 2 Configure page parameters. For details, refer to 5.1.3 *Manage Page*.

Step 3 Select at least one picture in window type list.

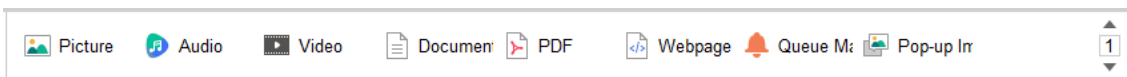


Figure 5-3 Window Type List

Step 4 Click to select a window to edit in Window List.

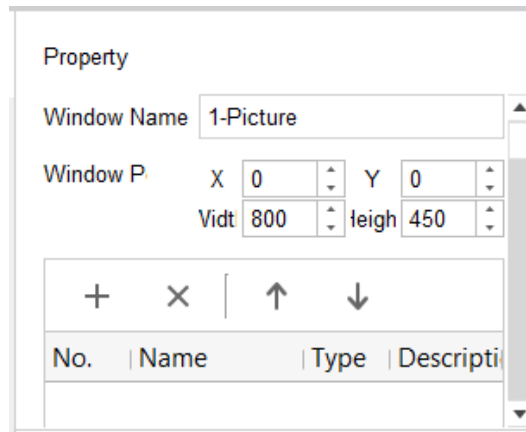


Figure 5-4 Window Property

Step 9 Click **Save** to save the program.

5.1.5 Create PDF Program

Step 1 Configure program basic settings. For details, refer to Configure Program Basic Settings.

Step 2 Configure page parameters. For details, refer to 5.1.3 *Manage Page*.

Step 3 Select at least one PDF material in window type list.

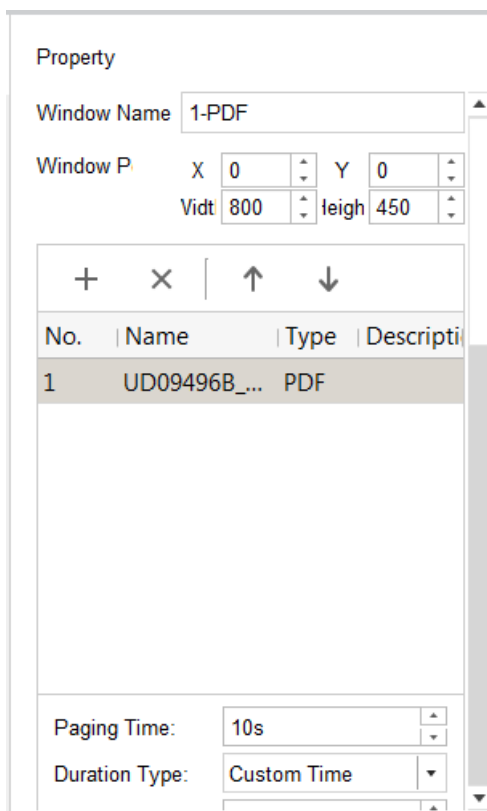



Figure 5-6 Window Property

- 2) Enter playback **Duration**.

Step 8 Click **Save** to save the program.

5.1.6 Create Document Program

Step 1 Configure program basic settings. For details, refer to 5.1.2 *Configure Program Basic Settings*.

Step 2 Configure page parameters. For details, refer to 5.1.3 *Manage Page*.

Step 3 Select at least one document material in window type list.

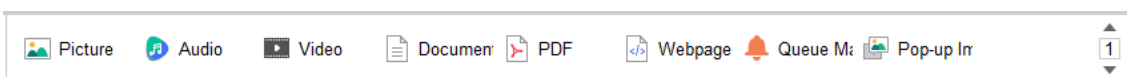


Figure 5-7 Window Type List

Step 4 Click to select a window to edit in Window List.

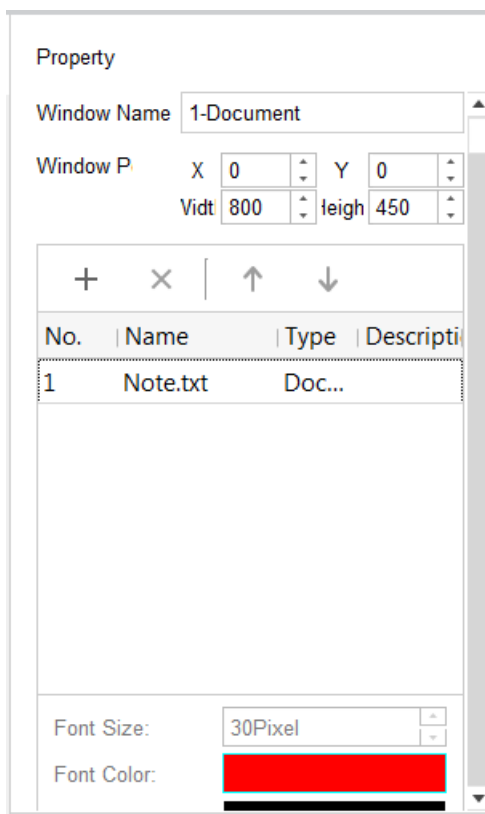



Figure 5-8 Window Property

- 1) Configure the its parameters, including **Font Size**, **Font Color**, **Background Color**, **Background Transparency**, **Scrolling Direction**, and **Scrolling Speed**.
- 2) Enter playback **Duration**. Repeat the step to set playback duration for other materials.

Step 8 Click **Save** to save the program.

5.1.7 Create Audio/Video/Live Video Program

NOTE

Two types of live video are supported: live video material and IP camera. Refer to *Add Dynamic Material* to add them.

Step 1 Configure program basic settings. For details, refer to 5.1.2 *Configure Program Basic Settings*.

Step 2 Configure page parameters. For details, refer to 5.1.3 *Manage Page*.

Step 3 Select at least one audio/video/live video material in window type list.

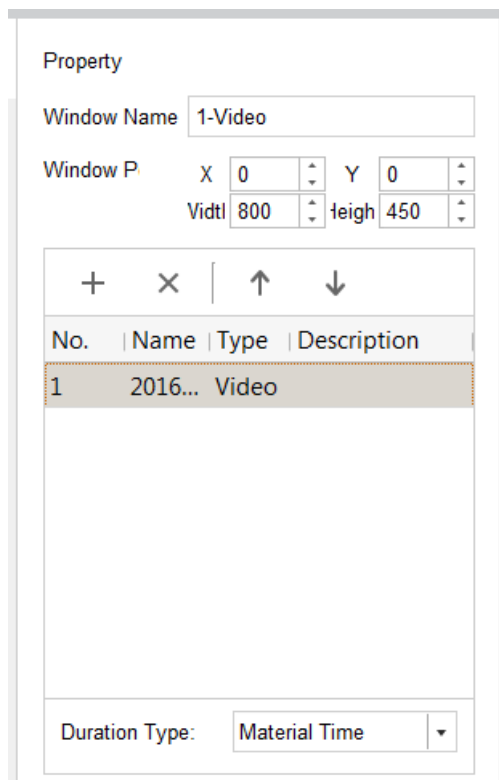


Figure 5-10 Window Property

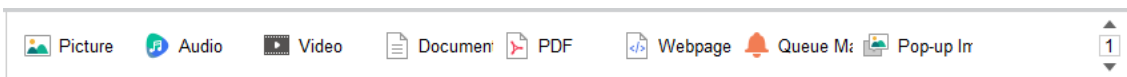


Figure 5-11 Window Type List

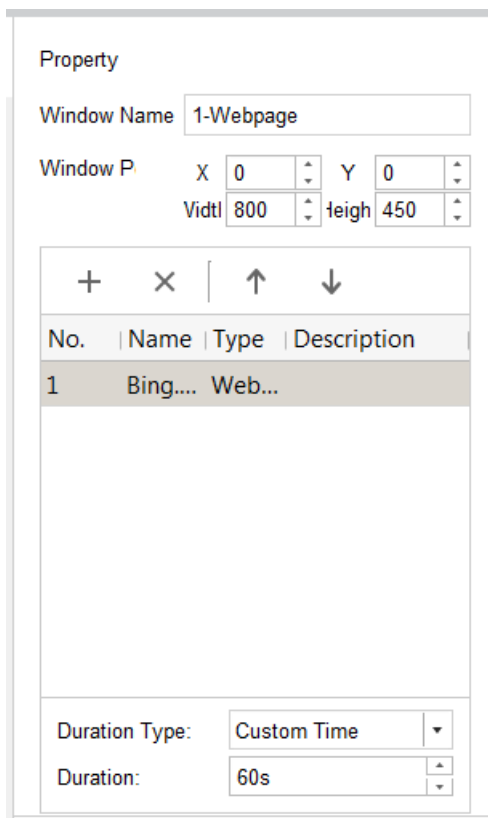


Figure 5-12 Window Property

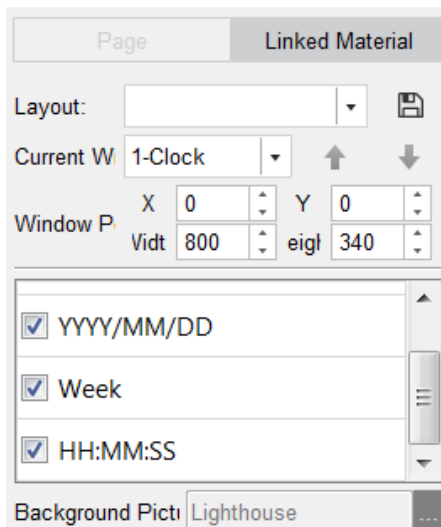



Figure 5-14 Window Property

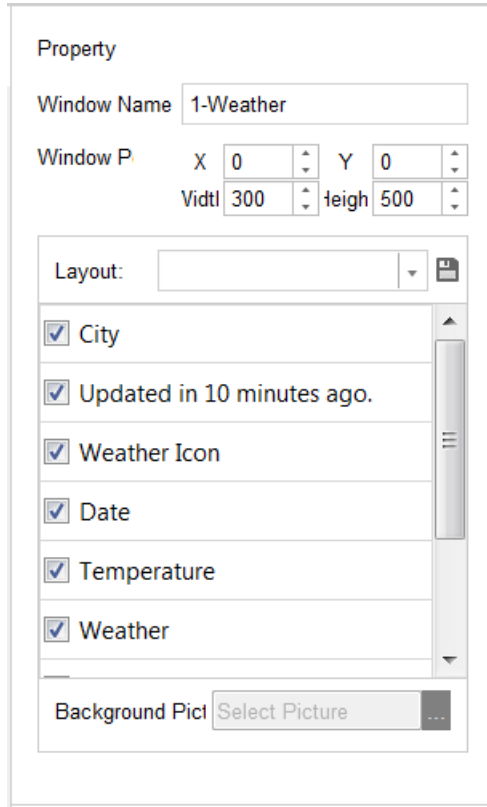



Figure 5-16 Window Property

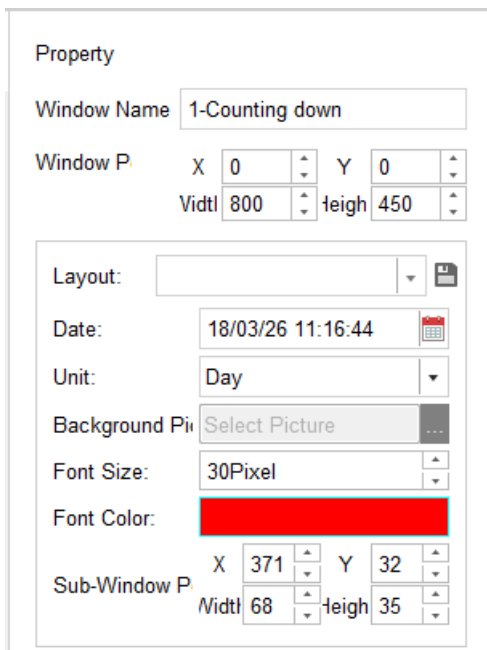



Figure 5-18 Window Property

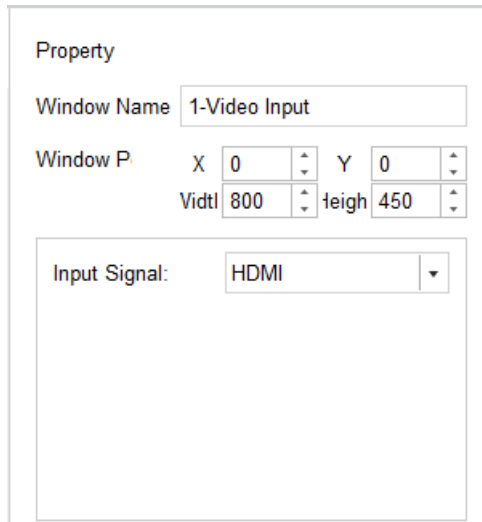


Figure 5-20 Window Property

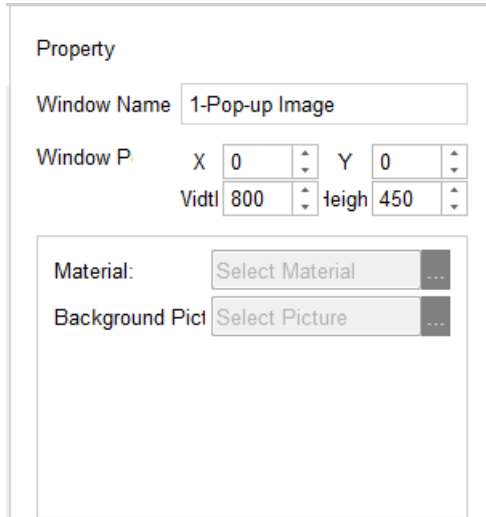


Figure 5-22 Window Property

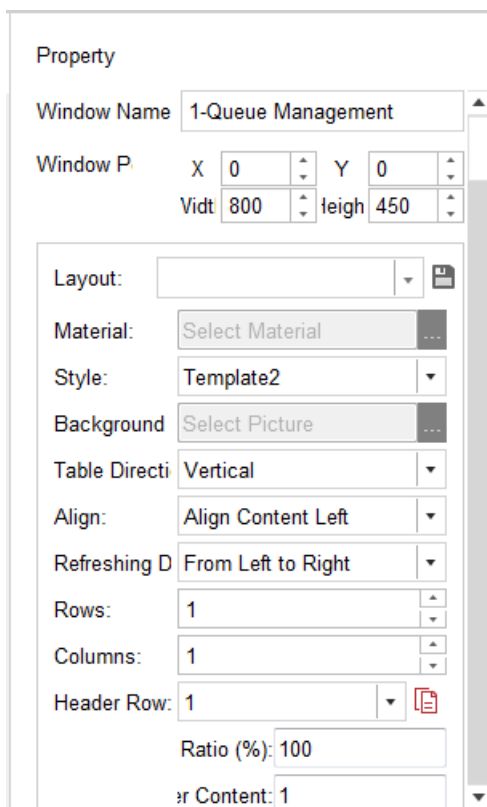



Figure 5-24 Window Property

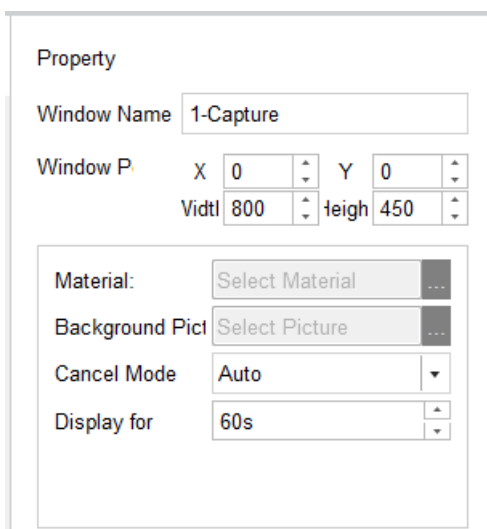


Figure 5-26 Window Property

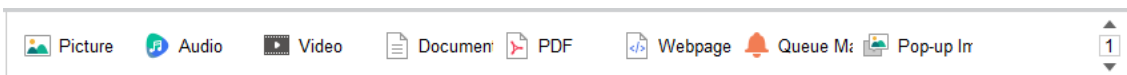


Figure 5-27 Window Type List

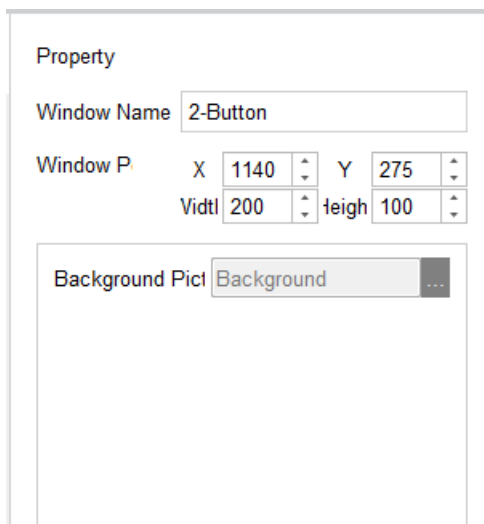


Figure 5-28 Window Property

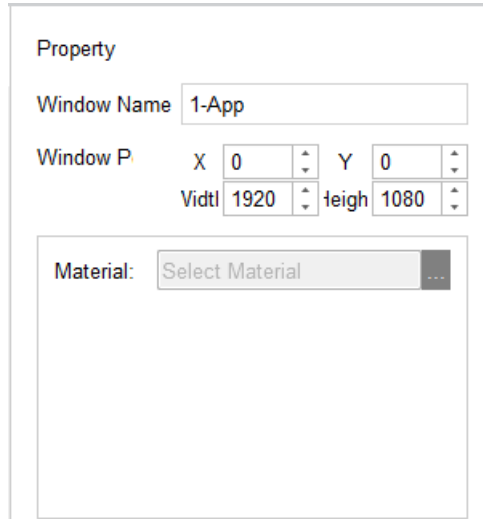


Figure 5-30 Window Property

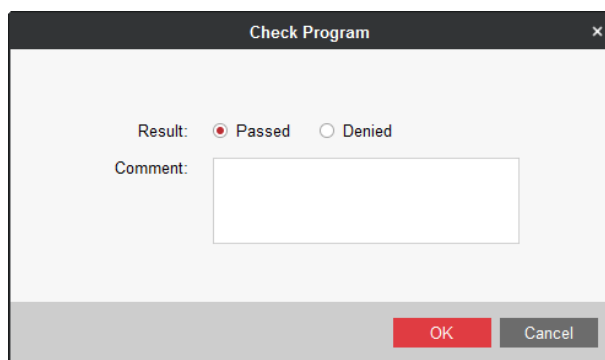


Figure 5-31 Check Program

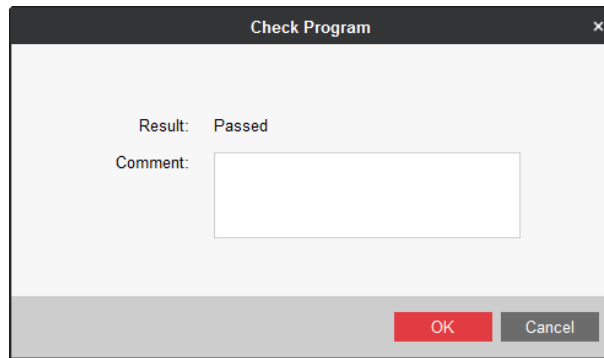



Figure 5-32 Check Program

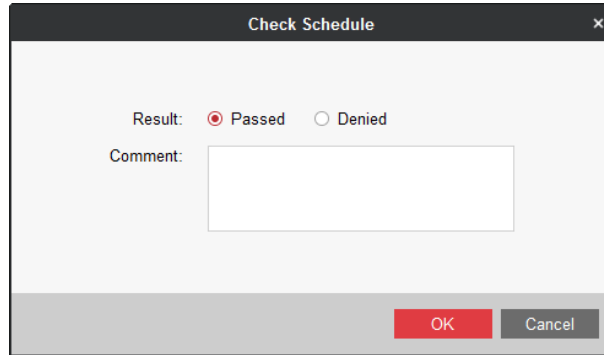


Figure 6-2 Check Schedule

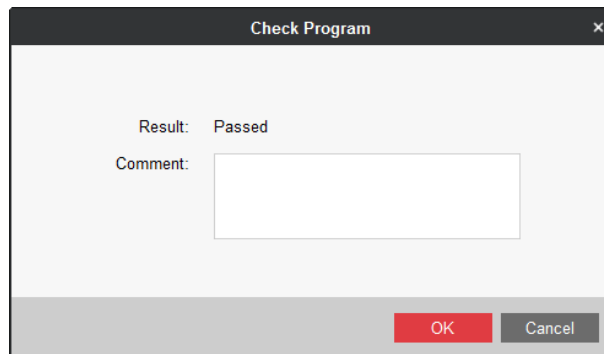



Figure 6-3 Check Program

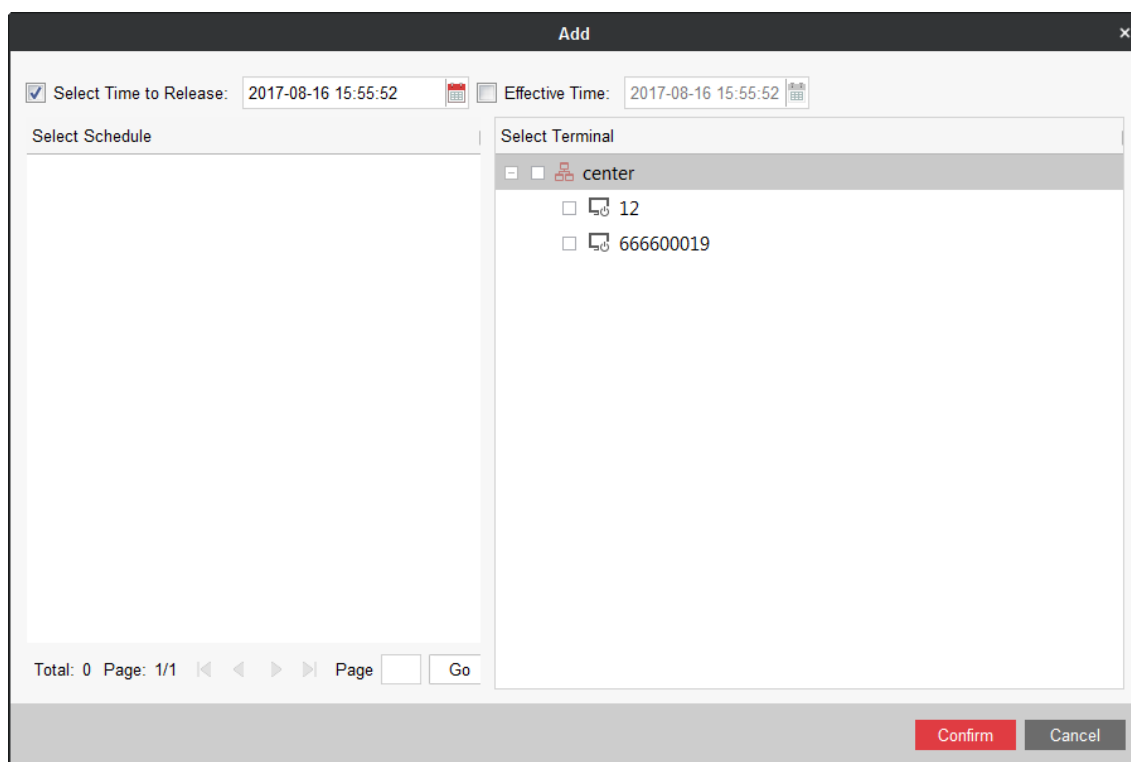


Figure 6-4 Release Schedule

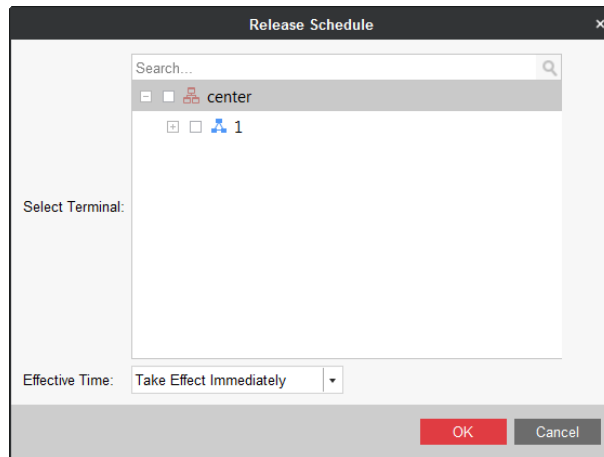


Figure 6-5 Release Schedule

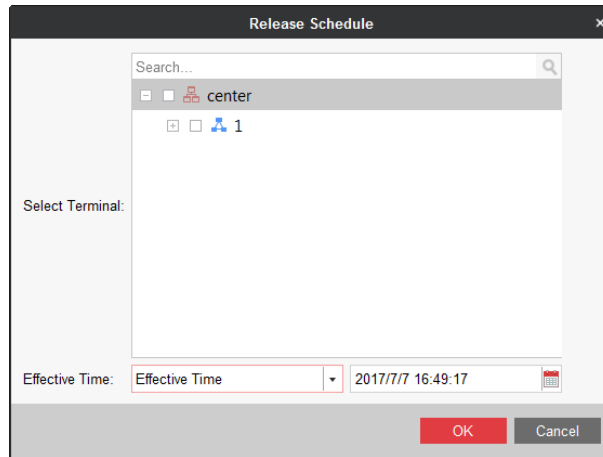


Figure 6-6 Release Schedule

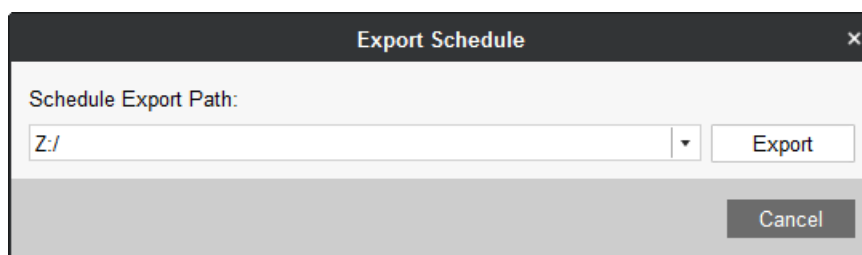


Figure 6-7 Export Schedule

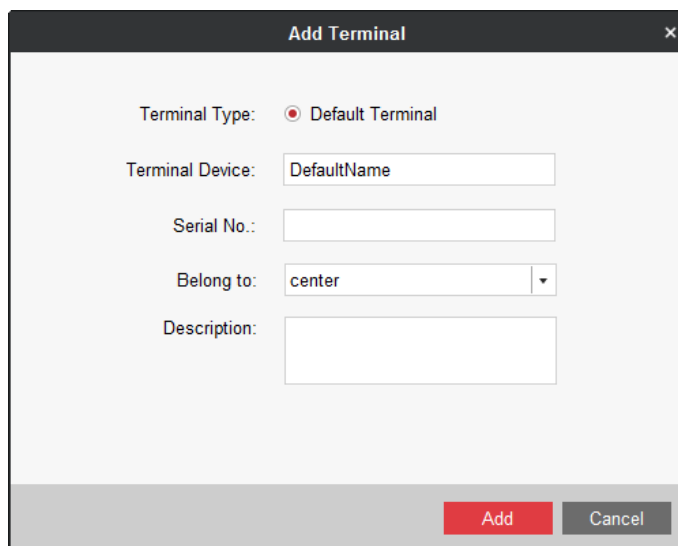


Figure 7-1 Add Terminal

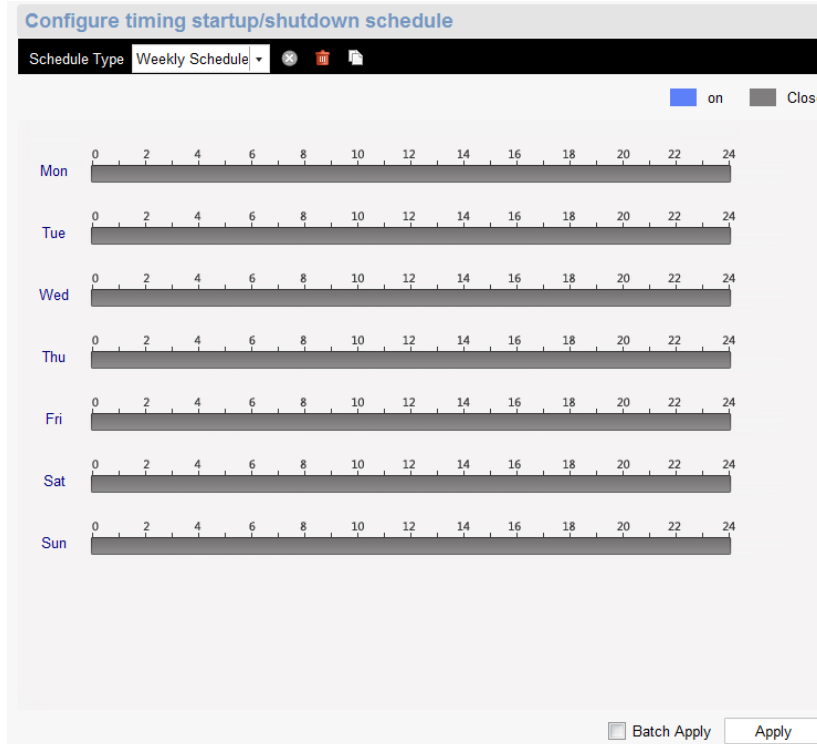


Figure 7-3 Timed Startup/Shutdown

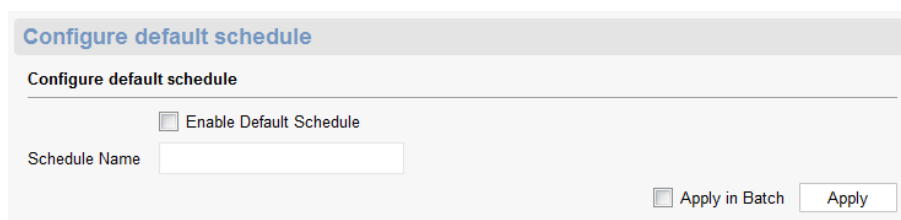


Figure 7-7 Default Schedule

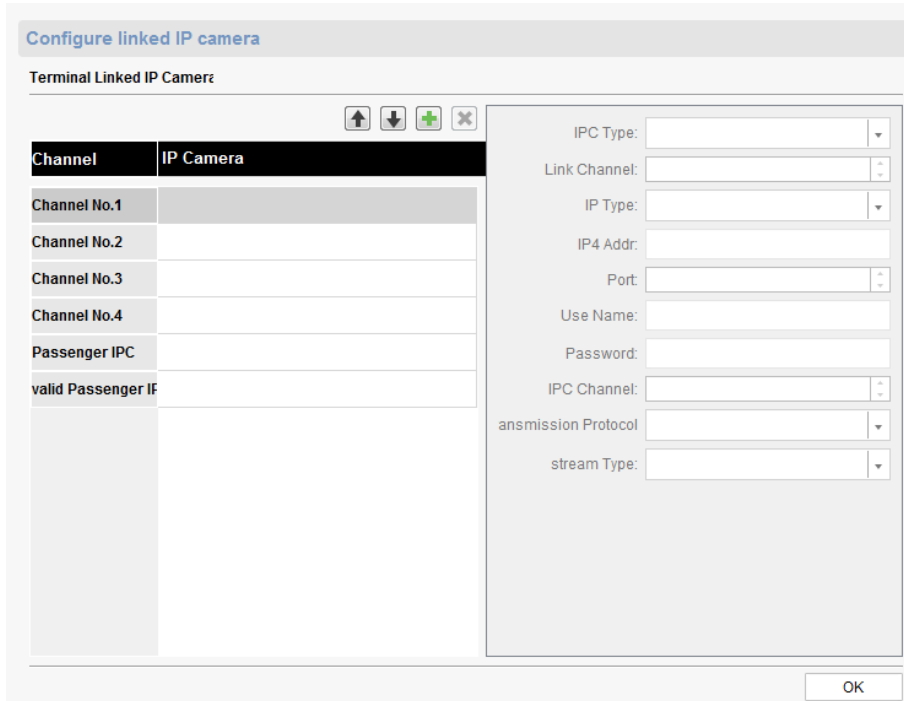


Figure 7-13 IP Channel

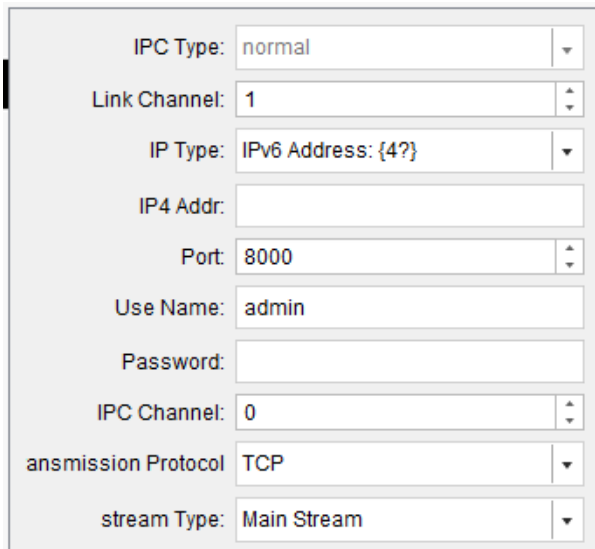




Figure 7-14 IP Camera Parameters

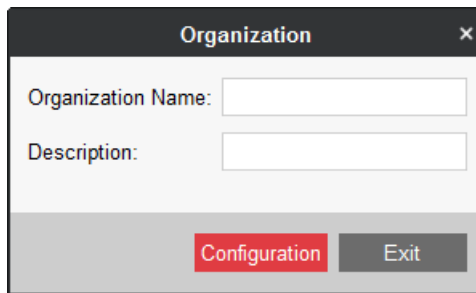


Figure 8-1 Create Organization

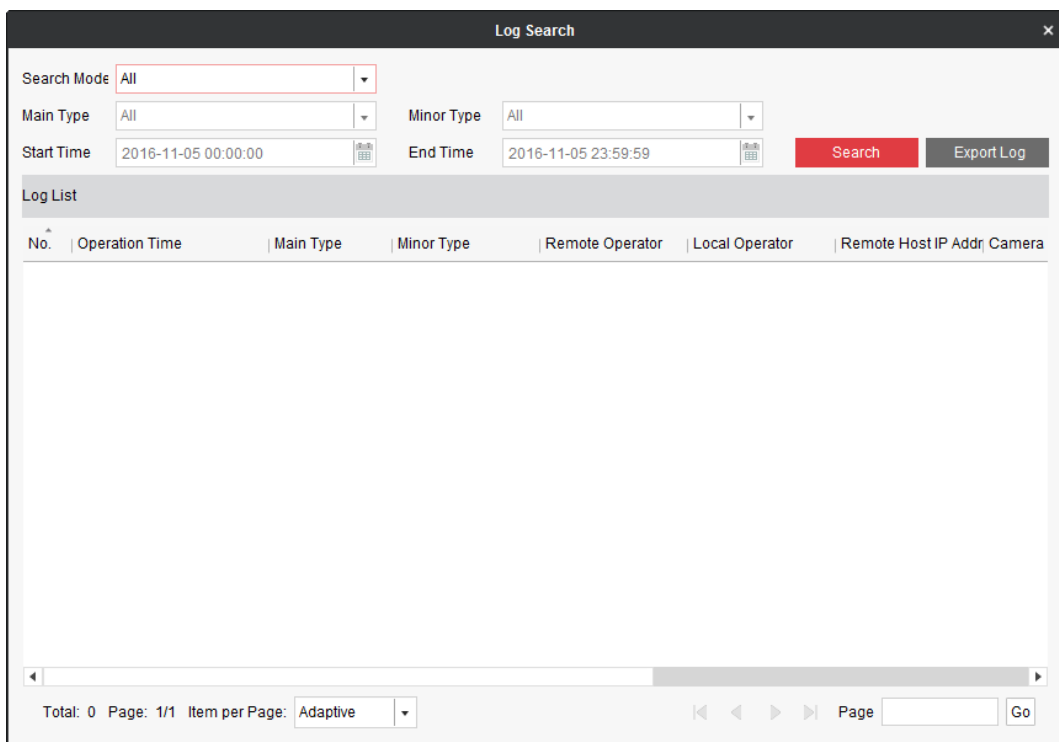


Figure 8-3 Log Search

Please narrow the time range or filter the log type for search if there are too many log files.

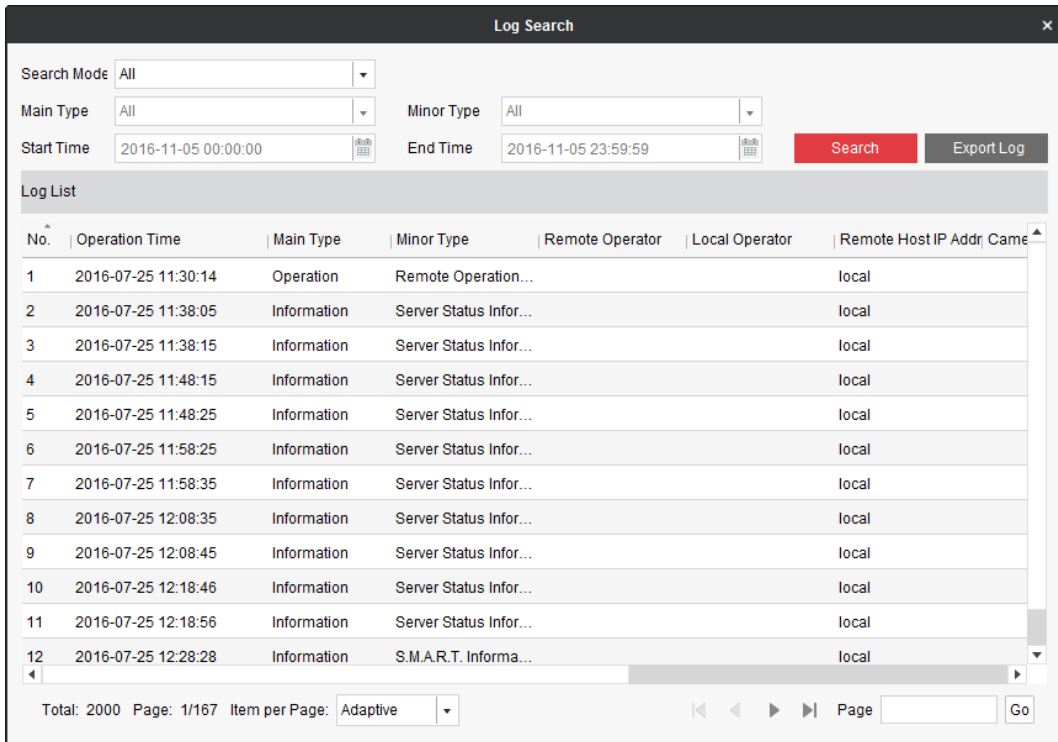


Figure 8-4 Log Search

Step 4 Click **Confirm** to export the selected log files.

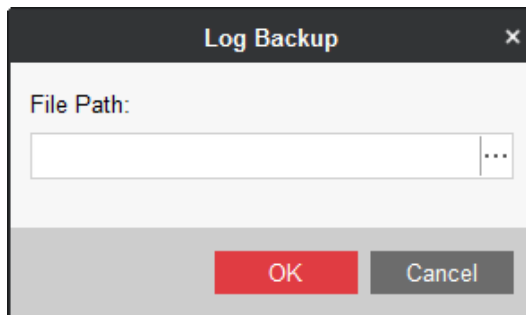


Figure 8-5 Log Backup

Step 1 Select the **Disk Management** item in menu bar.

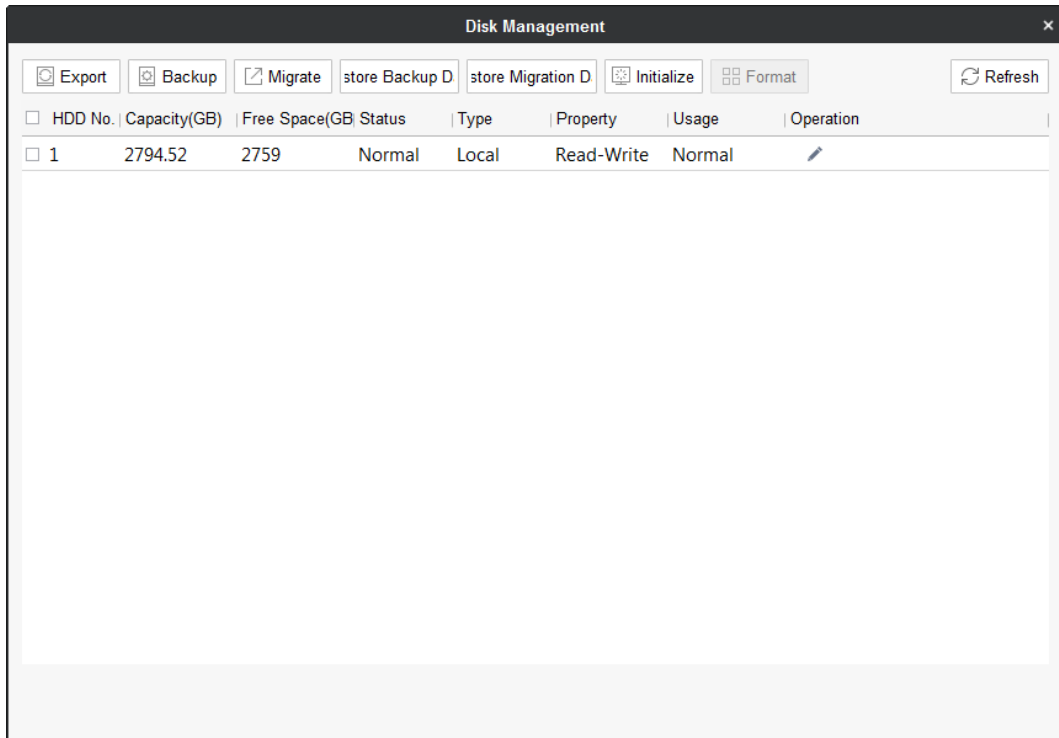


Figure 8-6 Disk Management

8.4.2 Configure HDD Usage

Step 1 Click of an HDD.

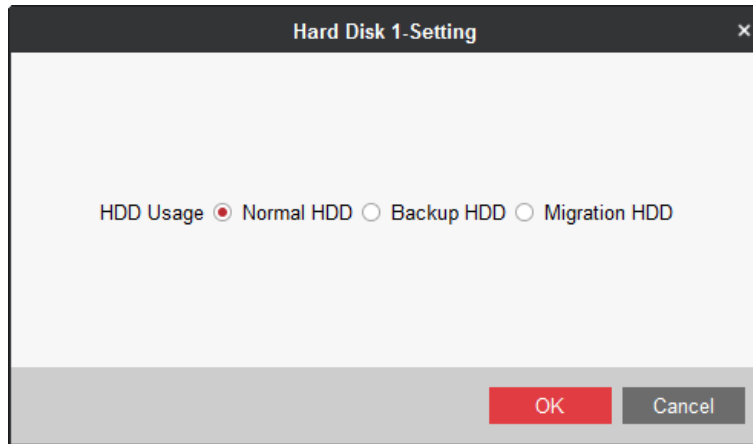


Figure 8-7 HDD Usage

- **Normal HDD:** Save information release server data.
- **Backup HDD:** Back up data for other HDDs in information release server.
- **Migration HDD:** Used to migrate data of one information release server to the other server.

Step 3 Click **OK**.

8.4.3 HDD Backup

Purpose:

To avoid data loss, you can back up data from normal HDDs to backup HDDs.

Create backup HDDs. For details, refer to 8.4.2 Configure HDD Usage.

 **NOTE**

- The capacity of backup HDDs must be larger than the capacity of HDDs to back up.
- Data of all normal HDDs will be backed up.

Manual Backup

Purpose:

Backup data up for once.

Step 1 Select the backup HDDs and click **Initialize**.

Step 2 After initialization, click **Manual Backup**.

Auto Backup

Purpose:

Device will regularly back data up by the set time.

Step 1 Select the backup HDDs and click **Initialize**.

Step 2 Click **Auto Backup**.

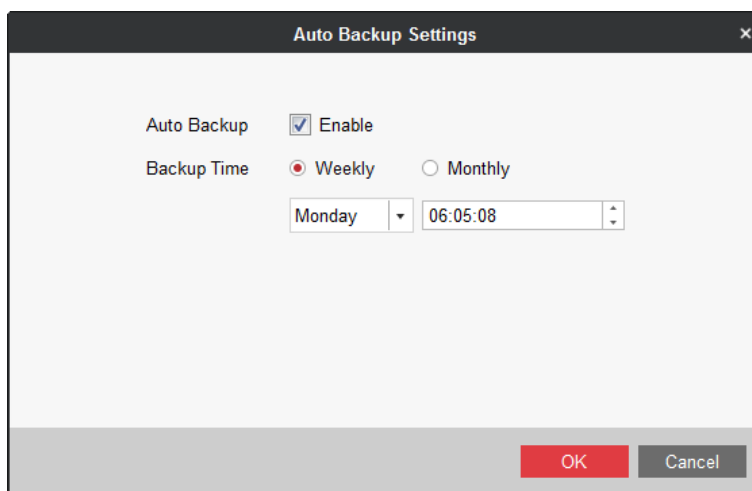


Figure 8-8 Auto Backup

Step 3 Check **Enable** of **Auto Backup**.

Step 4 Set **Backup Time**. Device will regularly starts backup by the set time.

Step 5 Click **OK**.

8.4.4 HDD Migration

Purpose:

Migrate data of one information release server to the other server.

Before you start:

Set all HDDs as the migration HDD. For details, refer to 8.4.2 Configure HDD Usage.

NOTE

- To ensure data completeness, you need to migrate data of all HDDs.
- After data migration, the configuration file database of new information release server will be replaced.

Step 1 Click **Migrate**.

Step 2 Install the HDDs to the new information release server.

Step 3 Log into the new server via client software.

Step 4 Enter Disk Management interface and click **Restore Migration Data**.

Step 5 After restoration, set the usage of all HDDs as normal HDD or backup HDD, and reboot server.

8.5 Server Maintenance

Select the **System Maintenance** item in menu bar.

- **Enable SADP:** Enable/disable SADP of the information release server. The function is enabled by default. You are recommended to disable SADP after deployment finished.
- **Enable SSH:** Enable/disable SSH of the information release server with the help of technical support. To improve network security, you're recommended to disable SSH.

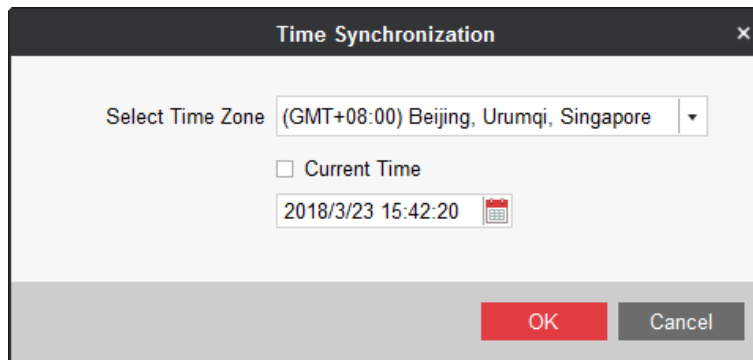


Figure 8-10 Time Synchronization

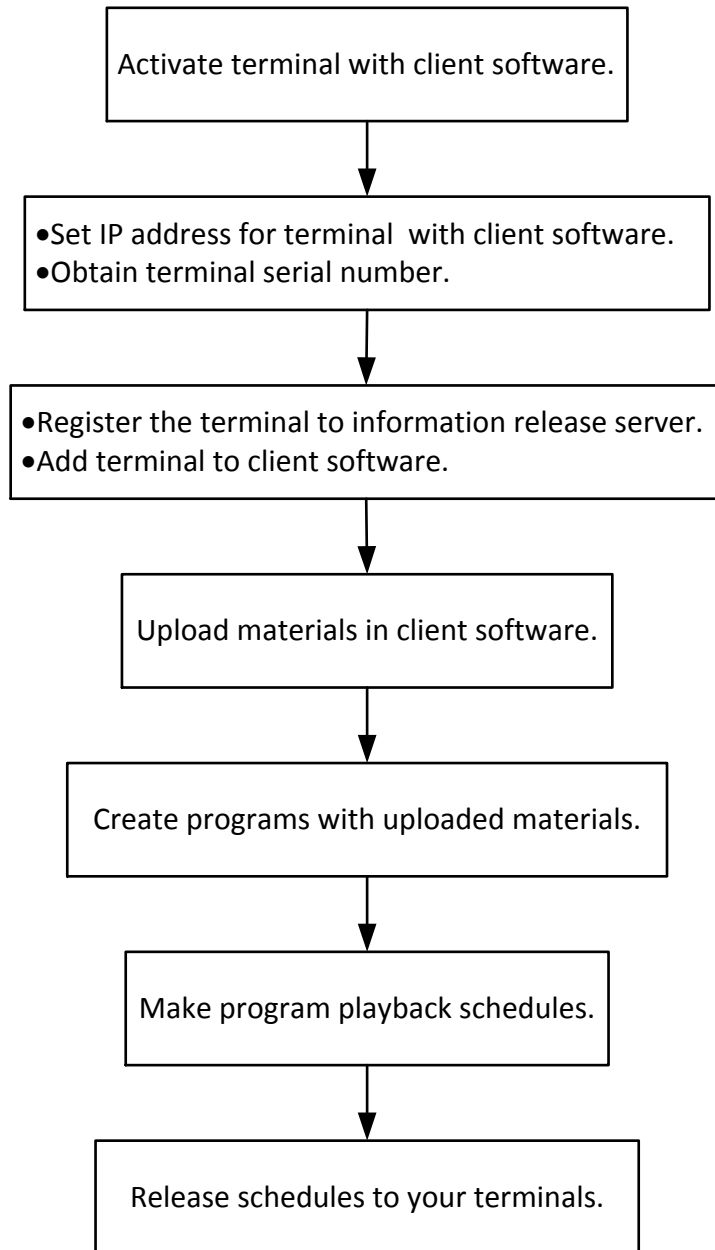
Step 2 Select **Time Zone** according to actuality.

Step 3 To synchronize server time with your computer time, check **Current Time**.

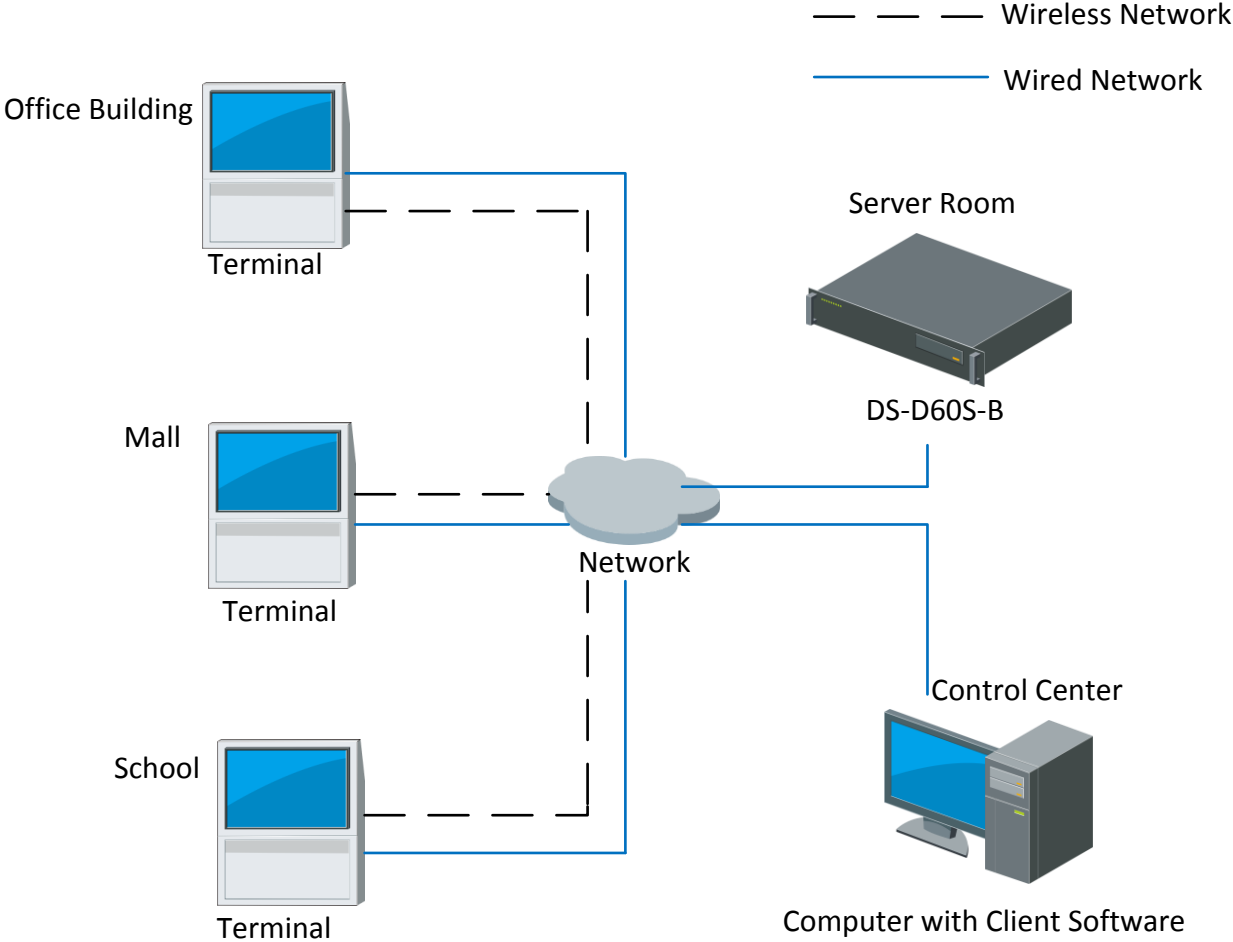
To adjust server time as your desire, uncheck **Current Time** and enter the time.
